## Extraordinary Occurrence

## Motoring Accident in Limerick

A motor accident which had tragic consequences occurred at the junction of Mallow street and O'Cennell street, Limerick, on Sunday at midnight, involving the death of a woman aged about 63 years.

Throughout the forenoon yesterday members of the Gardai were busily engaged

iu efforts to trace her identity.

Later in the day it was ascertained that her name was Lena Coilius, unmarried,, living in a room at 1 Windmill etreet Limerick.

It appears that she was crossing the main street at the time and was knocked down by a small Morris saloon proceeding down O'Connell street and rendered un-conscions. Rev Thomas Naughten, SJ,

was quickly on the scene.

Ten minutes after the tragic happening a station wagon similar to those used by companies at Shannon Aispert came down from the O'Connell Monument direction and in the act of proceeding past the crowd on the road struck the Morris car on the side and also hit Rev Fr Naughton, Gnard O'Donnell and the driver of the Morris car, Mr S Partill, 46 Sundrive Road, Phibabero' Road, Dublin. As a result of injuries sustained they were removed to Barriugton's Hospital, In William street barracks yesterday

morning, before a Peace Commissioner, Charles James Vile, c/o Royal George Hetel, Limerick, was charged with driving a motor vehicle (station wagon) while

dynnk.

The accused, an American citizen, was allowed out on bail.

After an X-ray had been carried out at Barrington's Hospital on Fr Naughton he was taken to St John's Hospital, where he is detained. He is suffering from shock and bruises to both legs and back. Mr Purtill is suffering from shock and injuries to the right eye and bruises to the right leg, while Guard O'Donnell sustained injuries to both legs. The latter was not detained.
