DEATH OF MR. J. MCCARTHY, BRIDGEMOUNT

There was a remarkably large and representative attendance of the people of Limerick and Kerry at the removal of the remains, and next day (Saturday) at the interment in the family vault in the old Abbey Cemetery, of John McCarthy, whose death at 61, took place at Bridgemount, Abbeyfeale, after a short illness, writes our Abbeyfeale correspondent. He was son of the late Dr. John P. McCarthy, M.D., M.O.; brother of Dr. Phil McCarthy, M.O., Abbeyfeale, and also of the late Dr. Willie McCarthy, M.D., M.O., the distinguished medical scientist, whose young life was sacrificed to duty. Deceased was a very popular member of this well-known County Limerick family, and his death was widely regretted. He was brother-in-law of Mr. M. J. Woulfe, solicitor, Abbeyfeale, and Mr. J. Lloyd, of Limerick. Amongst the large number of other relatives were Dr. P. J. Irwin, R.M.S., Mental Hospital, Limerick.
