DEATH OF MR. JAMES H. ROCHE

With very sincere regret we
announce the death of Mr. James
H. Roche, one of Limerick's oldest
citizens, who passed away this
morning at his residence, "Roche-
ville," Rosbrien, at the great age
of 91 years.

The late Mr. Roche, who was
born at Ballinamona, Hospital, Co.
Limerick, came into the city 78
years ago and by his industry,
ability and great driving force he
was soon to make a mark for him-
self as an industrialist. He was
chairman of the firm of J. H.
Roche and Sons, flour and meal
merchants, and was, besides, asso-
ciated with other enterprises, in-
cluding the Limerick Race Co., of
which he was a director. For
thirty-five years he was member of
the Harbour Board and prior to
the Treaty he held the office of
High Sheriff of the city for a
period of three years.

A fervent Catholic, he was a
Jubiliarian member of the Arch-
Confraternity of the Holy Family
attached to the Redemptorist
Church. Despite his great age he
was a regular attendant at its
weekly meetings, and his death will
sever an old and honoured link with
this great spiritual organisation.

To the bereaved family deep
sympathy will be tendered in their
bereavement.
