DEATH OF MR. P. COWHEY

With very much regret we announce the death of Mr. Patrick Cowhey, licensed trader and grocer, Athlunkard Street, Limerick, who passed away this morning at his residence. The deceased, who had been ailing for a considerable time back, was a native of Ballinaguile, Croagh, West Limerick, and had been intimately connected with the business life of the city since he came into it in his early years. He was a member of highly-respected farming stock, his parents becoming victims of the land war by being evicted when he was a young boy. A man of the most honourable and upright character, he was deservedly held in the highest esteem by all who knew him. Of a kindly, sociable and charitable disposition, he was in general a very estimable citizen, indeed, and his death removes one who was an excellent husband and father and the possessor of many other admirable traits and characteristics. He was father of Sister M. Roberta, St. Louis Convent, Rathmines; of Mr. Jack Cowhey, President of the Athlunkard Boat Club, and of Messrs. Patrick, Denis and James Cowhey. In his younger days he was closely associated with Gaelic games and was treasurer of the old Limerick Commercial Football Club. His wife pre-deceased him several years ago. To his bereaved family and relatives we extend our very sincere sympathy in their sorrow. The remains will be removed to St. Mary's Church at 8 o'clock this (Monday) evening and the funeral will take place at 2 p.m. to-morrow to Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery.

ACTION FOR POSSESSION.

Alfred E. Bromell, 7 Hamilton St., Birkenhead, England, sought possession of a house at 48 Edward St., Limerick, from Alice Nealon.

Mr. R. Ball, solicitor, appeared for the plaintiff, and the defendant was represented by Mr. D. J. O'Malley, solicitor.

Mr. McMahon (of the office of Messrs. J. Welply and Sons) said that the tenancy between the plaintiff and the defendant was a monthly one at 30/- rent. Notice to quit had been served on the defendant.

Cross-examined, the witness said there was no written tenancy in existence with the defendant. He agreed that a notice addressed to the defendant, and signed by Mr. Welply, stated that the rent was £3 9s. a month.

Mr. O'Malley submitted that as the figure for the rent on the civil bill and on the notice signed by Mr. Welply differed, the action should fail.

The Justice agreed and dismissed the action without prejudice.

NEW SCALE FOR NURSES
