WHAT POST MORTEM REVEALED

Gardai activity in the Friarstown area of Ballyneety, Co. Limerick, is believed to be connected with the death of a middle-aged man named James Droney, a small farmer, who died three weeks ago.

It was established, following a post mortem examination, that death was due to pneumonia. Traces of phosphorus poisoning, similar to that prescribed for the destruction of rats, were, however, found in the liver of the deceased. Some fowl died on the farm.

It is understood that a tin which is believed to have contained rat poison was yesterday found in a drain by the Gardai.
