

FATAL SEIZURE

Adare Young Man's Death

EVIDENCE AT INQUEST

While proceeding from his home at Adare to his work at Patrickswell on Saturday morning last, Mr. Thomas Quinn, aged 20, fell off his bicycle and died a short time afterwards. He was accompanied at the time by a fellow-worker, Patrick Lloyd, and later was brought back to his home, Dr. Costello and Rev. Father Casey, D.D., C.C., being in attendance immediately.

An inquest was held the same day by Dr. J. Clery, Knocklong, Coroner for the district, and a jury of which Mr. L. Naughton was foreman. Patrick Lloyd, Adare, stated in a deposition:—I am a groom employed by Captain Lysley, Patrickswell, and Thomas Quinn, deceased, was employed with me there. I called at his house this morning at 6.50 and we both left at 7 a.m. We walked about one hundred yards and then got on our bicycles going in the direction of Patrickswell. We were talking about the weather and as we came to the Rusty Gates at Shanbally deceased said: "We won't be able to do any schooling over the hurdles to-day owing to the snow." I was then about half a length in front of him when he swerved suddenly and his front wheel struck my back wheel. When I got clear I looked back and saw him lying on the road face downwards. I ran back to him and lifted him up and called him but got no answer. He was semi-conscious and tried to vomit. I saw a motor car coming and stood in the middle of the road to stop it. The driver pulled up and when I went to tell him he dashed past me.

CYCLED BACK TO ADARE FOR HELP

I then took off my coat, continued witness, and put deceased on it and cycled back to Adare for help and returned immediately, and when I arrived where deceased was lying I stopped the mail car and we put deceased in it. In my opinion he was alive at the time. We brought him to his home and put him into his bed. I then went for Dr. Costello. I could not say if deceased was then alive. He was in his usual good health that morning.

Michael Walsh, Adare, brother-in-law of deceased, deposed:—I live here with Mary Quinn and the late Thomas Quinn. I saw the deceased last night. He was then in good health. I was called early this morning, some time after 7 a.m., and cycled in the direction of Patrickswell and saw deceased lying on the roadside at Shanbally. I helped to put him on the mail car. I saw his bicycle there. The handlebars were twisted. There was nothing else wrong with it. I brought it home with me. I identify the remains as Thomas Quinn, my brother-in-law.

Sergeant Reidy, Adare, stated:—I am sergeant in charge of Adare. On receiving a report, I went to the scene of the accident at Shanbally about 10 a.m. Patrick Lloyd showed me where the accident occurred. Lloyd's bicycle was still at the place of the accident. There were no marks on the road to indicate where the accident occurred. The width of the road was 31 feet. The road was straight and the surface was wet. On the left-hand side of the road a width of eight feet of the surface was rough; the middle of the road was in good condition. I saw nothing on the road to cause the accident. I subsequently saw the deceased's bicycle. It did not appear to be damaged. I also examined Lloyd's bicycle and there were no marks on the rear wheel.

MEDICAL EVIDENCE

Dr. Costello, Adare, stated:—I am Medical Officer of Adare. I saw deceased at his mother's house. I found no fracture of the bones on deceased. In my opinion the cause of death was heart failure, following shock induced by the fall from his bicycle. I carried out a post-mortem examination, assisted by Dr. Hedderman, Croom, and found that deceased's heart was enlarged.

Dr. Hedderman, Croom, stated:—I assisted Dr. Costello at the post-mortem on deceased and I agree with his evidence as to the cause of death.

The Coroner said it was a very sad and tragic case. The deceased was living with his widowed mother and was her whole support.

The jury returned a verdict that the medical evidence showed that death was due to heart failure accelerated by the accidental fall off his bicycle while on his way to work at Captain Lysley's, Patrickswell.

The foreman, on behalf of himself and the jury, said he wished to offer their sincerest sympathy to deceased's relatives.

The Coroner and Supt. J. J. Cooney, G.S. Adare, wished to be associated with the remarks of the foreman.

Supt. J. J. Cooney, G.S., Adare, was in charge of the proceedings.

THE FUNERAL

The funeral of the late Thomas Quinn, whose death under such tragic circumstances cast a gloom over the village of Adare, took place from the Holy Trinity Church on Sunday, 16th inst., and was followed by a cortege of huge dimensions, representing all classes and creeds. Deceased was very popular in the district and the coffin was borne on the shoulders of his past schoolmates and fellow employees.

Very Rev. Canon Thornhill, P.P., and Rev. Dr. Casey, D.D., C.C., Adare officiated at the graveside.

Deceased's employer, Capt Lysley, was amongst those present and the great kindness and generosity shown by him on the occasion were unsurpassable.

BEET SEED GROWERS

GENERAL COSTELLO AT ADARE

A meeting of the Beet Seed Growers' Association was held at the Monastery Schools, Adare, on Sunday, 16th inst. (writes our Adare correspondent). There was a very large attendance.

Amongst those present were Major-General Costello, General Manager, Irish Sugar Company; Mr. Harris, chairman of the Beet Seed Growers' Association; Mr. Fahy, secretary, do.; Messrs. D. O'Brien, T.D.; P. Lillis, Co.C.; and J. Crowe; also experts from the Mallow Sugar Factory.

Opening the meeting, Mr. Harris said he was very pleased to see such a fine gathering, and said there were some experts present from the Mallow Sugar Factory to answer any questions which might arise. He asked Major-General Costello to address the meeting. Major-General Costello said that the purpose of the meeting was to get an area for the growing of beet seed. The area would have to be exempt from growing mangolds, as mangolds contained virus which was affecting beet seed. It was also proposed that the area should not grow its own stockings, which can be received from another area. The reason for picking the area in Limerick was because the beet seed grown there for the past few years was of a much higher quality than that in any other district. As this meeting was brought so suddenly on the farmers of the County Limerick, he would be satisfied to give them time to consider the proposals.

Mr. Lillis, Co.C., asked Major-General Costello to account for the decline in the percentage of the seed for the past few years. Major-General Costello replied that the seed for the past few years was of a smaller type. Answering another question as to how farmers were to carry on without mangolds, Major-General Costello said they could grow kale and they would have beet pulp.

It was decided that the beet seed growers of the various districts in the county should hold meetings to discuss the proposals, as they have been rushed on them, and they would be in a better position then to know how they stood.
