THE CITY "TECH"
Appointments Made
AGE LIMIT FOR OFFICIALS
FIXED
Mr. P. J. Donnell, B.C. Chairman, presided at a meeting of the City of Limerick Vocational Education Committee, held in the Municipal Technical Institute, last night.
Other members in attendance were: His Worship, the Mayor (Councillor J. C. Hickey), Mr. P. O'Connell, B.C.; Mr. P. J. Cusack, B.C.; Mr. M. O. Tuathigh, B.A., N.T.; with the C.E.O. (Mr. P. V. Twomey), and Mr. P. J. Stundon, Assistant-Secretary.
The C.E.O. informed the meeting that he had received a circular letter from the Department giving particulars of the new course of training: Woodwork Teachers. He had circulated it to the teachers, and they brought the matter to the notice of the students.
The letter was considered satisfactory.
The Royal Insurance Co. wrote reminding the Committee that their five years agreement relative to the insurance covering the "Institute" was nearing expiry, and asked if the Committee wished to renew the agreement.
The Chairman said he thought there was no necessity to make a change from the Royal Insurance Co. They had given good satisfaction.
Mr. O'Connell said that if they had an Irish company which could give the same premium it would be well to consider the matter. He suggested that the matter be advertised, though he would first of all like to hear the views of the Committee.
Mr. O. Tuathigh said he agreed with Mr. O'Connell; if it was possible to do business with an Irish company on favourable terms as compared with the present premium, he would support the suggestion.
Mr. Cusack considered that the Royal Insurance Co. was a decent firm, and thought that a change was not necessary.
The other members agreed that the Company had given every satisfaction.
Mr. O'Connell added, that if they had Irish firms doing the same business he contended that they should get priority over the Royal Insurance Co., which was incorporated in England. The matter should be advertised.
Chairman—Well, give me a proposition if you intend to change.
The C.E.O. pointed out at this stage that the present agreement would expire on 25th March, and there was little time for them to contemplate making a change.
Mr. O'Connell said that as the time was so short, he would withdraw his suggestion and agree to a renewal of the agreement.
The matter was not further discussed.

replies from eight applicants, the names of whom, and their qualifications, he sent to the Department for their observations, and they replied recommending five of the applicants.
THOSE RECOMMENDED
The first three suggested to be appointed were: Mr. M. J. Devereaux, 52 Lansdowne Park, Limerick, as part-time teacher (Drawing); Mr. Stephen John Hartigan Atkins, "Pragueville," Ardaraunacree (Electrical Engineering); and Mr. Arthur H. Grayson, 73 O'Connell Street, Limerick (Automobile Electricity).
The C.E.O. pointed out that the classes were being kept going at the moment by Mr. Hersey and Mr. Spencer. With the forthcoming appointments, he suggested ways of easing the situation, and further suggested that the first three applicants be appointed. The remaining two would be called later when the new engineering teacher (whole-time) to take Mr. Cleary's place would be appointed.
The Mayor proposed that Messrs. Devereaux, John Hartigan Atkins and Arthur H. Grayson be accordingly appointed.
Mr. O'Connell seconded, and it was carried unanimously.
Arising out of the engineering question, the C.E.O. said that Mr. Spenser had been working four extra hours each week, and Mr. Hersey seven hours extra, as a result of being under-staffed all along. He suggested that they should get some remuneration for this extra work at the ordinary part-time rates.
The Chairman said he could take it that all agreed with the suggestion.
Before the meeting concluded, the Chairman proposed a vote of sympathy with Mr. Whelan, B.C., on the death of his wife; and Mr. Cusack proposed a vote of sympathy with Mr. Tom Bernard, on the death of his brother, Peter. Both votes were passed in silence.

VOTES OF SYMPATHY.
