IRISH LABOUR PARTY

EAST LIMERICK COUNCIL

A very largely attended meeting of East Limerick Divisional Council of the Irish Labour Party was held at Dromkeen on Sunday, March 23rd. The following branches were represented—Dromkeen, Doon, Cappamore, Pallasgreen, Caherline, Caherconlish, Ballysison, Bohermore and Limerick. Mr. M. J. Keyes, T.D., and Mr. Sean Hayes, M.C.C., addressed the delegates. The following resolutions were passed unanimously: (1) "That this meeting of East Limerick branches of the I.L.P., representing the County Council road workers, resolve that we refuse to accept the suggestions of the Minister for Local Government and Public Health to create a partition in our county by making two rates of pay for road workers, and that we are prepared to accept the recommendation of the County Council and County Manager of a flat rate of 48/- per week for the whole county on the understanding that broken time be eliminated and that a man who presents himself for work at starting time in the morning will be assured of his day's pay."

A. J. SEXTON'S PROPERTY SALES.

Belfort, Charleville, Sold for £5,700 and Fees. On Saturday last, at the Salesrooms, 64 O'Connell Street, Limerick, Mr. Alfred J. Sexton offered for sale Belfort, Charleville, the residence of the late Mrs. E. Clanchy, deceased. The bidding for this residence, standing on 27 acres 1 rood 30 perches, S.M.; held under fee farm grant, subject to an adjusted rent of £6 9s. 8d., and in fee-simple, subject to the revised land purchase annuity of £4 17s. 6d. P.L.V. lands, £44 10s. 0d.; buildings, £26 5s. 0d.; opened at £3,000 and quickly reached £5,700, at which figure, and fees, it was knocked down to Mr. W. J. O'Shea, of Kilmallock. The price realised was considered most satisfactory. The sale of important yearlings, jewellery, Vauxhall saloon car, antique and costly modern pieces will be held at the residence on Monday and Tuesday, 14th and 15th April.

NEWCASTLE WEST FAIR

Newcastle West April fair on Tuesday was of medium size and supplies were much below those of normal years. There was a representative attendance of buyers, however, and despite the continuance of the rail transport hold-up and very inclement weather conditions, trade in some departments was much better than was generally expected. There was a fair all-round clearance of cattle at prices that were in keeping with current quotations. Owing to the closing down of the canning factories, old cows were in poor demand. Average prices:—Old cows, £6 to £12; three year-old missing heifers, £18 to £24; two year-old heifers, 1st class, £12 to £17; do., 2nd class, £9 to £11; two year-old bullocks, 1st class, £15 to £18 10s.; do., 2nd class, £8 to £12; yearlings, 1st class, £10 to £12; do., 2nd class, £6 to £8; milch cows, 1st class, £25 to £30; do., 2nd class, £16 to £23; bonhams, up to 16 weeks, £4 to £6 10s.; do., 8 to 10 weeks, 50/- to 70/-. Practically all pigs on offer at the April pig market on Monday were disposed of at £9 2s. per cwt.
