### MANSLAUGHTER CHARGE

The trial was opened in the Central Criminal Court, Dublin, to-day, before Mr. Justice Davitt and a jury, of William A. Lynch, an employee of Pan American Airways, Shannon Airport, who was indicted on a charge of manslaughter.

Lynch was charged with causing the death of Patrick Considine, aged 22 years, a labourer, who was knocked down by a motor van on the Ennis Road, Limerick, on the night of 18th December last.
