WEEKLY DAIRY MARKET.

Tuesday, June 10th—Full seasonable entry with more cows than heifers, and included a large number of choice cows, and for so late in the season there was quite a number of buyers wanting to fill up, the result being that there was ready and brisk demand for promising and useful cows, and heifers of the right stamp, trade being a bit extra sharp, and exchange easily effected. Good enquiry for choice dairy cows, and best class heifers made full current values and touched top rates. Business was firm and steady, rates being fully maintained, all round brisk demand with satisfactory wind up and practical clearance. Supply not equal to demand. Top price for dairy cows went to Mr. D. Ryan, Coolishal, Caherconlish, at £41 10s., the runner-up being Mr. C. McNamara, Singland, Limerick, at £40. Dairy cows, best, £35 to £41 10s.; second run, £27 to £34 10s.; incalf and calved heifers, best, £26 to £31; second run, £22 10s. to £24.
