Pleading guilty to being found in possession of two unlicensed bulls, John Neville, Clonshaheen, Kilmaley, was fined 2/-, with £5 expenses, at Ennis District Court.

Defendant said one of the bulls had been delicate and died a fortnight after the Inspector visited his farm. The other bull had been afterwards presented for inspection and was now licensed.

Deputy District Justice Nunain said legislation governing unlicensed bulls had been enacted to prevent the keeping of such animals with the object of improving livestock to a high standard and this legislation must be enforced.
