FALL PROVES FATAL.

DEATH OF CO. LIMERICK FARMER

The death of Mr. James O'Connor, 63, farmer, Clounanna, Patrickswell, took place in St. John's Hospital (writes our Adare correspondent). Deceased met with a sad accident on his farm when he fell from a load of corn and was rendered unconscious. After spiritual and medical attention, he was removed to hospital, where he succumbed to his injuries on the 16th inst.
