FATAL CRASH

PATRICKSWELL TRAGEDY

Dr. J. P. Cleary, Coroner for East Limerick, opened and journed an inquest at Patrickswell, Co. Limerick, on Monday night into the circumstances connected with the death of Mathew O'Brien, road ganger and widower, of Barnakyle, who died from injuries received when he was involved, while cycling, in a collision with a motor lorry at Patrickswell. The crash took place almost in the centre of the village. Death, it was stated, was almost instantaneous.

Medical evidence was given by Dr. D. Brennan, Patrickswell, who described the injuries sustained by the deceased and said death was due to shock and concussion.

O'Brien, Mathew son decased, gave evidence of identification, and on the application of Supt. J. J. Cooney, who represented the authorities, the inquest was adjourned sine die.

The Coroner, Supt. Cooney and the foreman of the jury joined in expressing sympathy with the relatives of the deceased.
