## PATRICKSWELL TRAGEDY

Dr. J. P. Cleary, Coroner for  
East Limerick, opened and ad-  
journd an inquest at Patrick-  
swell, Co. Limerick, on Monday  
night into the circumstances con-  
nected with the death of Mathew  
O'Brien, road ganger and widower,  
of Barnakyle, who died from in-  
juries received when he was in-  
volved, while cycling, in a collision  
with a motor lorry at Patrick-  
swell. The crash took place almost  
in the centre of the village.  
Death, it was stated, was almost  
instantaneous.

Medical evidence was given by  
Dr. D. Brennan, Patrickswell, who  
described the injuries sustained by  
the deceased and said death was  
due to shock and concussion.

Mathew O'Brien, son of the  
deceased, gave evidence of identi-  
fication, and on the application of  
Supt. J. J. Cooney, who represen-  
ted the authorities, the inquest  
was adjourned sine die.

The Coroner, Supt. Cooney and  
the foreman of the jury joined in  
expressing sympathy with the re-  
latives of the deceased.
