on Tuesday night, June 17th last, Thomas Fahey, the 72 years old, unfortunate victim, was dreadfully and fatally savaged in his own shop. Apparently he carried on a mixed trade at Mungret Street, selling groceries and other household necessities as well as liquor. On the night of the murder he had no assistant with him in the premises. The crime was discovered after 10 o'clock by a Mrs. O'Neill, who knocked at the door. Getting no answer, she tried her own key and found it opened the hall door. She entered and saw the body of

Fahey lying on the ground.

Counsel went on to say that evidence would be given that Fahey was killed by savage blows about the face and head, and the prosecution suggested that weapons used were a stove lid, a sauce bottle and a paint tin, which were all found at the scene of the crime.
