The death of Mrs. Elen Dore, widow of the late Mr. Gerald Dore, ex-N.T., Ballygoughlan, Glin, has taken place (writes our Glin correspondent). She was daughter of the late Mr. John and Mrs. Johanna Lynch, farmers, Ballinagoul, Glin, staunch supporters of the Land League in their days, as was also the family of Mr. Gerald Dore at that time. The house of Mr. Gerald and Mrs. Elen Dore, was headquarters for Sinn Feiners in Glin and elsewhere during the troubled times. Those who sought shelter then or their descendants attended in vast numbers at her funeral to Kilfergus, on Thursday of last week. The funeral was one of the largest yet to Kilfergus. Deceased was mother of Guard John Dore, Tipperary, of Mr. James Dore, Principal, St. Patrick's Secondary School, Glin; of Mrs. Michael Adams, Glin, and of Mrs. Josephine Hedges, England. She was sister of Mr. Michael Lynch, Ballinagoul, Glin, of Mrs. Sarah Connolly, and of Mrs. Margaret Jameson, Glin. To all these and the other bereaved relatives deepest sympathy is offered.

Rev. Father Carroll, P.P., and Rev. Father Connors, C.C., officiated at the Parish Church, and graveside at Kilfergus.

Mrs. Dore's death is the second within a week in the family, her niece-in-law, Mrs. Elen Mullane, having died within that time. They lived four doors apart in Main St.
