DEATH OF AGED MAN

While walking on the Limerick-Ennis Road, near Clondrinagh, Caherdavin, on Saturday evening, an aged man named Frederick Mason came into collision with a motor car and sustained fatal injuries.

Mason, who was aged about 78 years, was an inmate of the Protestant Aid Home, Ryves's Path, Limerick. He was a widower and a retired jeweller. He was walking in the direction of Ennis when the accident occurred. The motor car involved was driven by Mr. Michael Ring, Sixmilebridge.

The deceased was conveyed in the Corporation ambulance to the Co. Infirmary, where life was pronounced extinct. He had two broken legs and other injuries.

An inquest will be held to-morrow.
