AS RESULT OF BURNS

As a result of receiving severe
burns around the body when her
clothes became ignited, Annie
Power, aged 4 years, of 15, Donnel-
lan's Buildings, Prospect, Limerick,
succumbed to her injuries on
Sunday night in the City Home and
Hospital.

It appears that the little girl was
at the time of the accident—which
occurred on Saturday night—
playing in her home with other
young members of her family. Her
mother had occasion to go to a
nearby shop for milk, and, while
absent for a very short time, she
left in charge her six-years-old
daughter, the eldest of the family.
In the process of playing in the
vicinity of the kitchen range one
of the children accidentally pushed
the deceased towards the stove and
her clothes immediately caught fire.
The alarm was raised, and a neigh-
bour who was passing the house at
the time heard the screams and
rushed to the kitchen to find the
little girl's apparel in flames. A
towel was wrapped around her, and
the flames were extinguished. The
Corporation Ambulance, which was
quickly on the scene, conveyed her
to Barrington's Hospital, and she
was subsequently removed to the
City Home and Hospital, where she
expired as stated.
