BRUFF FAIR

Bruff fair was of large dimensions. Trade was very brisk and a large number of buyers effected a good clearance in all departments, demand being good on all classes. About 200 wagon loads of cattle left Kilmallock Railway Station and quite a large number of cattle were purchased by local buyers. Bonhams met a fairly good demand at the pig market held subsequent to the fair and prices paid ranged from £4 10s to £6 each.
