DEATH OF MR. D. HEDERMAN, BALLYNEALE

The death has taken place of Mr. Daniel Hederman, of Ballyneale House, Ballingarry, Co. Limerick, at the age of 92 years (writes our Ballingarry correspondent). He was father of Mr. John Hederman, Glenbevin House, Croom, and of Mr. Vincent Hederman, The Glen House, Ballingarry, and of Mrs. Owen Binchy, Charleville. Two other sons are members of the medical profession, one in Devon, England, and one in Bulawayo, Africa. He was uncle of Dr. William Hederman, Croom. A well-known breeder of horses and cattle, he farmed 270 Irish acres. He bred some well-known racers, such as "Loanawand," winner of £6,000 in stakes, and "Old Rielly," winner of over £5,000. "Haine" won the Irish Derby. In 1904 Mr. Hederman founded the now well-known Ballyneale Stud and was a well-known figure at the sales at Newmarket each year. He bred "Pompelious," one of the fastest horses in England. He was one of the first Catholic Magistrates to be elected in West Limerick. Under the old Grand Jury system, Catholics had no say in public affairs and when Mr. Drew, of Drewscourt, near Castletownconyers, died, a Magistrate was brought from Wales, but Mr. Hederman contested the election. The voting was 16 for Mr. Hederman, 15 for the man from Wales. He was the first Barony High Constable for County Limerick, but had to resign the Magistracy when elected. He was for some years a member of the Limerick County Council. A member of a very old West Limerick family, the tombstone in the family burial ground at Shanavoha, Granagh, shows that the first member of the Hederman family was laid to rest there 280 years ago.
