MR W. LYNCH, ROSSA VILLAS

The unexpected death of Mr. William Lynch, 5 Rossa Villas, on the 6th February, came as an undouble-decker and he was sta expected shock to his numerous friends and relatives in Limerick City and County. His passing recalls to those who knew him, what has now passed into history-the turbulent days in Ireland from 1916 to 1921.
