This senseless and unworthy attitude often gives an undue opportunity to "chancers" and people of mediocre talent and tends to keep a better type of candidate from going forward at election times. It is the duty of every good citizen to take an intelligent, practical and sympathetic interest in politics, for in no other way will it become possible to always have a supply of good material for discharging national functions in a proper way.
