CITY ABATTOIR PROJECT

The City Manager (Mr. M. Macken, B.A.) has been informed that the engineers of the Department of Local Government have approved the draft plans submitted for the proposed abattoir for Limerick. This means that the Corporation may now proceed with the preparation of the specification and other final data.

AN EMPHATIC DENIAL

In Stockholm to-day it was denied that military agreements were being made as between Denmark and Sweden on one side and the United States and Britain on the other. The defence ministers of Denmark and Sweden declared that the report of such agreements was influenced and was in fact "lies from beginning to end."

ANOTHER LINK WITH SHANNON.

Munich, the famed cultural centre of Germany, will, from Sunday next, be linked by air with Shannon Airport. Pan American Airways announced at Shannon Airport yesterday that their clipper services will fly into the German city twice weekly on Sundays and Wednesdays. This will be the first commercial air service to fly to Munich. The airport to be used is Reim, outside the city, which is a modern field operated by the U.S. Army Airforce.

RED SNOW.

People living near the Turkish Red Sea port of Sinope awoke on Wednesday to find the countryside covered with reddish snow. The red snow was believed to have been caused by the presence of desert dust in the atmosphere when the snow formed.
