IN NEWCASTLE WEST

AREA

The death has occurred after a comparatively brief illness of Mr. William Hurley, Ballyine, Newcastle West. A native of Galway, deceased worked as an electrician in Limerick City for many years before retiring to his farm holding at Ballvine, where his charming personality and unlimited fund of humour won him a host of friends. There was a very large and representative attendance at the funeral from Ardagh Church to Monegae cemetery. Rev. Father Ruddle, P.P., and Rev. Father Wilmott, C.C., officiated at the graveside.

The death occurred on Sunday of Mr. Patrick Woulfe, Elm Hill House, Ardagh, member of an old and esteemed West Limerick farming family. Deep sympathy will be extended to the bereaved widow and family. There was a large and representative attendance at the funeral from Ardagh Church to Grange Cemetery on Tuesday.

THE BOHER GUILD

Mr. Michael Ryan, vice-chairman, presided at the monthly meeting of Boher Parish Council on Thursday, April 29th.

The chief topic of discussion was the second annual gymkhana, which, as already announced in the advertisement columns of the "Leader," is to be held in Boher on June 20th.

It was decided at the meeting to have the same number of jumping events as last year and that a cup should be presented for the open event. Major J. G. O'Dwyer, of Corbally, has again very kindly consented to judge the jumping.

Realising from their experience of last year that many of the spectators would have happier memories of Boher Gymkhana if they could have had a cup of tea on the grounds, the Council decided to enlist the aid of the ladies in running a tea-stall. The matter is now in the hands of a very willing and capable ladies' committee.

The secretary reported that a grant at the rate of £4 per acre had been received from the County Council towards the cost of plots rented locally for the production of potatoes.

A letter from the County Manager stated that the matter of serious flooding, which took place in Scart last Autumn, was being looked into by the County Surveyor.

It was decided to call a general meeting of the Guild for May 13th. Full particulars re Gymkhana will be advertised in the "Limerick Leader" in due course.
