FINAL TRIBUTE

Late Dr. Hedderman

THE INTERMENT.

The funeral of the late Dr. William Hedderman, Glenwood, Croom, took place to Shanavoha and was a striking testimony of the widespread regret caused by his passing and of the deep sympathy felt for his widow, family and relatives.

Aged 63 years, deceased was born at Rathkeale House, Rathkeale, and was son of the late Dr. William Hedderman, Rathkeale, a family long associated with the sporting and farming life of County Limerick. Educated by the Jesuits, he studied medicine at the Royal University of Ireland, where he took out his degree in 1909. After graduating, he was for a time House Surgeon in the Mater Hospital, Dublin, and subsequently practised in England. In 1914 he was appointed Medical Officer of the Croom and Fendalton Dispensary districts, as well as visiting physician to the County Hospital, Croom.

ALL-ROUND ATHLETE.

The late Dr. Hedderman was an outstanding sportsman, and in his early years was an athlete of prominence, particularly as a runner and jumper. In his student days he proved himself to be the best all-round athlete, by winning outright the Chancellor Cup for the Golden Jubilee of the university, in three consecutive years 1906, 1907, 1908. During those years he also won the Jubilee Cup for the mile handicap, the Roche Jubilee Cup for the cross-country championship and the Jubilee cups for the half mile and long jump. The late Dr. Hedderman was a keen follower of the Co. Limerick Hunt, having, in his early days, hunted with the Croom Harriers. He was a keen sportsman, and besides his activities on the hunting field, he was a noted angler and a splendid shot. He was a well-known figure not only in his native district and in the centre of his medical profession, but throughout the country generally, and the news of his death, which took place in a Dublin Nursing Home, came to the people of Croom and surrounding districts with a deep sense of personal loss. A profound feeling that the grim reaper Death with its kindly harshness, had snatched from them a tried and true friend. He had lived his life among them; his never-failing gaiety had won them their love, and his tireless industry had gained their utmost respect. Nature had fitted for him a dual role; he was the light-hearted companion of the young and the trusted confidante of the old. Go n-eanaidh Dia trocaire ar a mian.

THE FUNERAL.

The remains were removed by road from Dublin, and following Requiem Mass in St. Mary's Church, Croom, the funeral took place to Shanavoha, where the remains were interred.
