LIMERICK CATTLE MARKET.

WEEKLY MARKET, SATURDAY, MAY 22nd.

Dairy cows and heifers The entry of cows and heifers was again more than seasonable, with a total of 121 cows and heifers. The lateness of the season and the heavy entry did not in any way adversely affect prices, which were fully maintained on the basis of recent values. The number of cows and heifers which sold under the hammer at to-day's market was the second best this season, only very few lots failed to clear. The entry included a bigger proportion of good cows and heifers than at any previous market this season, especially the former, which comprised the greater portion of the entry, the clearance and turnover almost reaching last week's very high figures. Top price for heifers went to Mr. David Fitzgerald, Staunton Lodge, Ballysimon, at 46 guineas. Top price for dairy cows went to Mr. P. Fitzsimons, Borrigoen, Askeaton, at 46 guineas, for a calved cow and calf, the runner-up being Mr. James Ryan, Garryowen, Limerick, at £42 15s., closely followed by Mr. John Harnett, Fox Hall, Charleville, Co. Cork, and Mr. A. J. Hogan, Sixmilebridge, at £42 10s. each. Incalf and calved cows, best, £42 to £46; seconds, £38 to £41 10s.; others, £31 to £36 15s.; small, £18 to £30 10s. Incalf and calved heifers, best, £42 to £46; second, £35 10s. to £40; others, £29 to £34 10s.; small, £26 5s. to £28.

Store cattle—The entry showed a considerable increase and included quite a good selection of strong cattle as well as choice well-bred yearlings. Trade was again good and practically a complete clearance was effected, the demand for yearlings being practically good, some choice Hereford Cross year-
