Doon Carnival Events.

The Doon G.A.A. Carnival last week, had a Marathon Road Race, and the Cycle Road event for the Saxon Cup. It was a strange coincidence that both event resulted in dead heats. The Marathon from Cappawhite to Doon was, as I stated, a dead heat between C. Grady, Doon, and T. Carroll, Annacarty, with D. Dwyer, Solohead, third.

Mick Moran was third, and his brother, Tom, fourth. The holder, P. A. Barry, retired with a puncture near Cappamore. Seven competed and gave of their best in one of the best events of the Carnival. Congratulations to Parker, who has inscribed his name on this cup in his first season. Likewise best wishes to M. Martin on his first big race achievement. As runner-up in 1947 he deserves to share the honour this time.
