WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Wednesday, June 23rd:—Cattle—Decreased entry, beef in fair numbers met steady demand and ready exchange; nicely finished medium-weighted heifers and bullocks freely bid for and cashed; well fed heiferish cows easily placed at full values; trade for prime fat cattle steady; quality and condition commanded buyers; secondary cows and older not quite so much in favour as last week, and slightly easier rates ruled. Good clearance in the beef section of the market. The entry of stores did not include many drafts of strong or forward feeders; mostly young cattle; promising lots with condition found ready buyers at full current rates; dairy heifers again in strong demand; secondary cattle also met a good trade. Small entry of yearlings, choice heifers and bullocks enquired for, especially coloury dairy heifers. In store section trade was brisk and sharp with an early clearance effected, full seasonable turnover. Fat heifers and bullocks, best, £46 to £49 10s.; second run £35 to £39; fat cows, best, £42 10s. to £49; second run, £32 to £39; others, £25 to £32; old, £15 to £24; 2½ and 2 year old bullocks, best, £34 10s. to £39; second run, £23 10s. to £29 15s.; 1½ year olds and yearlings, best, £18 to £22 15s.; second run, £10 15s. to £16 17s. 6d.

Sheep—Slightly less sheep penned, the entry being of a mixed description, not up to the standard of recent markets. Strong attendance of buyers; firm tone and enquiry for choice pens, including heavy sheep, and well fed wethers with quality wanted and easily cashed; half meated and secondary lots met a dull trade, with value...
