DEATH OF MR. T. MULCAHY, RATHKEALE

The death of Mr. Thomas Mul-
cahy, which occurred at his resi-
dence in Rathkeale on June 30th,
caused very sincere regret among
all sections of the general public
in the town and parish and to many
friends elsewhere. Deceased was
a brother of Right Rev. Cornelius
Mulcahy, P.P., Dean of the Diocese,
and Dr. W. Mulcahy, M.O., Rath-
keale. He was an industrious and
successful farmer and proprietor
of a well-known and long-estab-
lished business in the town. A
kindly and obliging neighbour, he
was noted for his big-hearted but
unobtrusive spirit of generosity
and charity that made him admired
and beloved by those who knew
him intimately.

There was a very fine funeral
when the remains were removed to
St. Mary's Church on Wednesday
evening and again at the interment
on Friday, which took place in the
New Cemetery after Requiem High
Mass.
