**CUT SHORT BY DEATH**

The death occurred in a Dublin Nursing Home on Saturday, 24th ult., of Mr. Philip Leahy, Horticultural Instructor, who was the youngest son of Mrs. T. Leahy and the late Mr. Timothy Leahy, Beenanaspug, Athea (writes our Athea correspondent). Only 26 years of age, of a quiet and unassuming disposition, he had not long completed a brilliant academic course, and his premature passing on the threshold of a promising career is deeply regretted by a wide circle, who extend their sympathy to his bereaved mother, sisters and brothers. He was brother of Mother M. Bonaventure, Ladies of Mary, Los Angeles; of Professor P. Leahy, M.E., D.Ph., University College, Dublin, and of Mr. T. Leahy, Horticultural Instructor, Piltown. Educated at St. Michael's College, Listowel; Ballyhaise Agricultural College, and the Albert College, Glasnevin, he won a horticultural scholarship—open to all Ireland—value £360, and tenable for four years at U.C.D. The latter achievement is regarded as a very singular distinction in that particular sphere of study.

There was a very large attendance—representative of West Limerick and North Kerry—at his funeral, which took place to Knockanure Cemetery.
