ANNUAL SHEEP SALE.

On Tuesday, August 31st, Messrs. Wm. B. Fitt & Co. held their Annual Sheep Sale at The Paddocks, Limerick. This fixture is now one of the most important of the Annual Sales held at The Paddocks. The entry showed a decrease on last year, and comprised lambs, breeding ewes, fat and store sheep and rams. There was a large and most representative attendance of 1939. On whose soul, Sweet Jesus, Nicholas Hickey, Cloud buyers from a wide area, and included many strangers. Lambs, as usual, formed the largest section, numbering 671, and included some pens of outstanding merit. Generally, the majority of the entries were of a useful description, but on the whole not up to the standard of last year's sale. Cross-bred Oxford Downs and Suffolks came in for most attention, and there was active trade for all classes of choice lambs; and well done store lambs met with a firm and ready exchange; small lambs also changed hands. All round, prices did not equal the high rates of last year's annual sale, because the lambs were not as good. Top price .. 3 for lambs went to Mr. T.
