ANNUAL SHEEP SALE.

On Tuesday, August 31st, Messrs. Wm. B. Fitt & Co. held their Annual Sheep Sale at The Paddocks, Limerick. This fixture is now one of the most important of the Annual Sales held at The Paddocks. The entry showed a decrease on last year, and comprised lambs, breeding ewes, fat and store sheep and rams. There was a large and most representative attendance of buyers from a wide area, and included many strangers. Lambs, as usual, formed the largest section, numbering 671, and included some pens of outstanding merit. Generally, the majority of the entries were of a useful description, but on the whole not up to the standard of last year's sale. Cross-bred Oxford Downs and Suffolks came in for most attention, and there was active trade for all classes of choice lambs; and well done store lambs met with a firm and ready exchange; small lambs also changed hands. All round, prices did not equal the high rates of last year's annual sale, because the lambs were not as good. Top price for lambs went to Mr. T. Kennedy, Ballinstona, Kilmallock, at 130/- for a pen of Border Leicester crosses, and Mr. David Irwin, Kilmeedy, was the runner-up at 125/-; Mr. Michael Cahir, Springfield, Sixmilebridge, obtained 124/-; Mr. P.
