GREAT WORKER IN GOOD CAUSES

The death of Mrs. Mona Murdock, which occurred recently in New York, deprives all deserving Irish causes of a loyal supporter who gave unselfish devotion to everything that had for its objective the furtherance of the welfare of Ireland. She was also a very active charity worker, giving much of her time to organising dances, dinners, etc., for the relief of the needy in the first instance and to pay honour to someone who had given distinguished service to Ireland in the second. Her activities brought her into contact with outstanding personalities in New York, among whom were the Irish-born Mayor of that city, Brigadier-General ("Bill") O'Dwyer, who always addressed her as "Little Mona."

An outstanding member of the Auxiliary Section of the Limerick Men's Association, Mrs. Murdock gave splendid assistance in the organising of dances and raffles to raise funds to help in purchasing racing craft for St. Michael's Rowing Club, with the late Teddie Forsyth, etc., and, in fact, her whole life in New York was one round of work in national and charitable causes.

At a meeting of the Limerick Men's B. and S. Association held in New York, a resolution of sympathy was passed to the family and relatives of Mrs. Murdock and many tributes were paid to the work she had performed as a member of the Ladies' Auxiliary Section of the Organisation. "A silent prayer was offered for the repose of the soul of the deceased and the meeting adjourned as a mark of respect."

The following is taken from a New York newspaper:—"It is difficult to believe that Mrs. Mona Murdock is dead. For many years deceased was active in all Limerick functions and was a most pleasing personality."

Mrs. Murdock was born in Limerick and was sister of Mr. David Morton, Wolfe Tone Street, to whom sympathy is offered in his bereavement.
