WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 8th.

Cattle—Substantially increased supplies marketed this week, and a much better class; a particularly good show of prime fat cattle; full attendance of buyers, both home and shipping. Trade opened steady; demand brisk for prime medium weighted heifers, also heifer cows at full rates; choice fat cattle wanted and sold well; secondary cows and older sorts for canning met a slightly firmer market. Forward stores were readily bid for, and values generally maintained. In the young store cattle section business somewhat quieter than recent markets; the right stamp of feeding bullocks in good demand, and nice dairy heifers found favour. Substantially increased turnover on last week, and a good clearance. Fat heifers and bullocks, best, £38 10s. to £46 10s.; second run, £34 to £38; small, £31 to 33; fat cows, best, £39 10s. to £43 10s.; second run, £30 10s. to £36 10s.; others, £28 15s. to £30; old, £13 10s. to £23 10s. 2½ year old bullocks, best, £33 to £36 5s.; second run, £28 to £30; heifers, £31 10s. to £35. 2 year-old bullocks, £25 15s. to £31. 1½ year-old bullocks and heifers, £24 to £27; second run, £17 to £21 10s.

Sheep—Seasonable numbers, and a good show of mutton; full attendance of buyers; offers firm and ready for choice pens; hoggets and wethers of nice quality and well fed, met steady exchange; prime sheep looked for; secondary sheep and pens lacking finish met a quiet market; useful feeders and well-bred stores changed hands at steady rates; no lambs on offer; ewes quiet. Satisfactory clearance. Hoggets, best, 170/- to 180/-; second run, 160/- to 166/-; small, 145/- to 155/-. Fat middle weight, 167/- to 170/-; second run, 151/- to 160/-. Ewes, 120/- to 145/-.
