WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Wednesday, September 22nd:—
Cattle—Supplies forward showed a slight decrease on last Wednesday; good attendance of buyers, with shipping and local interests well represented. In beef department full supplies, demand again active and firm, with steady sale for prime heifers, which were readily bought up at full current values; nicely fed small heifers also in keen request; cows of the better class in strong demand, especially prime heavy cows; fresh young cows also met a good sale; secondary and older sorts suitable for canning met a free sale at late rates. Small entry of aged and young stores, trade for which was rather quiet; well bred bullocks wanted, and sold at recent rates. Choice 1½ year old feeding bullocks and dairy heifers met a steady sale at about late rates. The sale wound up with a steady and satisfactory finish; full seasonable turnover in beef department; complete clearance almost effected.
