

## MURDER TRIAL OPENS

The trial opened in the Central Criminal Court in Dublin, to-day, of John Fanning (28), chemist's assistant, Shandon Park, Phibsboro', who is charged with the murder of Mrs. Kathleen Boyne, thirty-five year old widow of Geraldine Street, Dublin, whose body was found at Howth in May last. It is stated that the trial will last a week. There will be 47 witnesses examined and there are over 60 exhibits. When charged to-day, Fanning replied in a firm voice: "Not guilty."
