

CHARGED

Before Justice C. S. Kenny, B.L., at Limerick City District Court to-day,

A number of helpers at the recent carnival held at Healy's Field, Corbally, were charged with permitting the games of "Pongo," "La Boul" and "Roulette" to take place contrary to the law.

Four of the defendants were also charged with providing the use of tents for such games.

The Justice said that he would dismiss the summons concerning the games of "La Boul" and "Roulette" under the Probation of Offenders Act, and would simply dismiss the summons in connection with the "Pongo," as it had been held to be legal by the Circuit Judge in a case at Ennis.
