Next Week's Films (BY E. C.)

There are only two new films due in Limerick next week, the American picture, "The Lady From Shanghai," and the English "Temptation Harbour." Here are my previews of these attractions as well as the revivals, re-issues and retains.



GRAND CENTRAL—"The Lady from Shanghai" was made by Orson Welles, an actor who has astounded Hollywood by his revolutionary ideas in producing, directing, camera work, story treatment and introduction of very loud background music. This latest effect is a thoroughly fascinating "movie" and shows touches of imagination seldom equalled in the film capital. He stars in the picture as well with able help from Rita Hayworth, Everett Sloane and Glenn Anders. The climax is one of the most exciting ever seen.

Mr. Welles has defied every conventional rule of movie making, and his results are well worth watching. Most audiences will enjoy this picture, but serious students of cinema technique will revel in its many innovations.



SAVOY—"The Best Years of Our Lives" (now showing twice daily at 3 p.m. and 8 p.m.) has been retained for all next week, when it will conclude its short season in Limerick. Drama and comedy are skilfully blended in this production, winner of the academy award for the best film made in 1946.

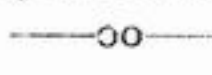

POPULAR FIGURE

Death Of Mr. Michael Quinlan



OUTSTANDING PERSONALITY

With very sincere regret we chronicle the demise of Mr. Michael Quinlan, Reaskmore, Pallasgrean, which took place at his residence yesterday after a prolonged illness.

The late Mr. Quinlan, who had reached an advanced age, took a very prominent part in public affairs up to a quarter of a century ago. For many years he was a member of the Limerick County Council, and Chairman of the old Tipperary No. 2 District Council. A forceful speaker, he never minced his words, yet there was no more popular man in public life in his day. Throughout his long and active career he was a staunch and loyal supporter of the Irish Parliamentary Party, and enjoyed the personal friendship of John Redmond and other national leaders of that period.

But the deceased was, too, a prominent figure in the realm of sport. He owned and trained many famous grtyhounds, and there was no more esteemed figure on Irish coursing fields. At Clounanna he was a leading personality, and few did more than he to make the Irish Cup an outstanding success.

Both in his private and public life, the late Mr. Quinlan was held in the highest regard and esteem. His bon homie dispositon, knidness of heart, and simplicity of manner endeared hm to hosts of frends all over Munster. His passing will be deeply regretted, and we join with the general public in tendering to the family deep and heartfelt sympathy in their bereavement.
