Kilkenny Cup (32 all ages) last year when French Rebel was knocked out in the first round. Water Principality went out in the first round of the Derby, for which he was one of the favourites. His form is good this season, as he ran through a 16 all age at Kilmacow, Kilkenny, and there is a whisper that he led the Connacht Cup winner, **Darkling**, by three lengths in a trial.

Viper Robert, a trial stake winner last year, was drawn in the third round of the Tipperary Cup recently, while the speedy **Little Voices**, which reached the fifth round of the Derby and then narrowly beaten by the eventual winner, was also unsuccessful in the Tipperary Cup.

LIMERICK CANDIDATES.

Strange Spot won a duffer stake at Loughrea recently, and **Barnard Rambler** a 16 all-age at Donerale. **Sullivan's Record** got to the third round of the Connacht Cup, while **Kind Regards**, it will be remembered, was led three lengths by future Tiger (eventual winner) in the Irish Cup last season, and then went into the final of the Irish course.

Dark Prancer won two courses at Rathkeale in the Limerick Cup a few weeks ago, but did not go to tips for the third round. This useful dog was beaten half a length by rompawn **Monarch** in last year's derby.

Another Limerick representative, **Deal Thompson**, was beaten in the second round of the Limerick Cup, but has an unbeaten record on the track.

Mr. Tom Morris has a strong candidate in **Musketeer**. This angerton black ran up to **Smashing Navy** in an all age at Cashel a few weeks ago, and last season reached the fifth round of the derby.

Berrin Joke got to the final of a all age at Ennis, the winner of which was **The Gosling's Pet**. **Field Commander** is one of this season's trial stake winners, having won at Millorglin for Mrs. D. F. O'Brien, Akpark, Tralee.
