CASE FOR GENERAL SCHEME.

If this be true it makes a strong case for advocating a general scheme when one considers the large area of fertile land affected.

MR. CULLIGAN, LATE C.I.E.

Mr. Michael Culligan, Janesboro, Limerick, who died recently, was son of Mrs. Mary Culligan, and the late Patrick Culligan, of Kilrush. He was son-in-law of the late John O'Connor, Lissycasey, a well-known figure during the Land League and Parnellite movements.

The late Mr. M. Culligan took a lively interest in the Trade Union Movement and for a number of years was Secretary of the Ballybrophy Branch N.U.R.
