(To the Editor, "Limerick Leader.")

Dear Sir—My attention has been
 drawn to recent letters appearing in
 your paper regarding weekly sales
 of dairy cattle. When I read the
 first letter in regard to this matter
 I came to the conclusion that it
 referred to sales in East Limerick
 and not in Limerick City, but in
 case there would be any mis-
 apprehension in the minds of any-
 body concerning my auction, which
 is conducted every Saturday at the
 Limerick Cattle Market, no private
 sales of dairy cows or heifers are
 allowed under any circumstances.
 This is well known to both buyers
 and sellers attending my market,
 and further proof of this, if neces-
 sary, can be shown by the fact that
 on account of its importance and
 the very big numbers attending this
 sale every Saturday, practically all
 the cows and heifers are sold under
 the hammer in the ring.
