Brisk enquiry for useful drafts of feeding bullock, especially forward lots, which were easily cashed at full values, and more of this class could easily have been sold. 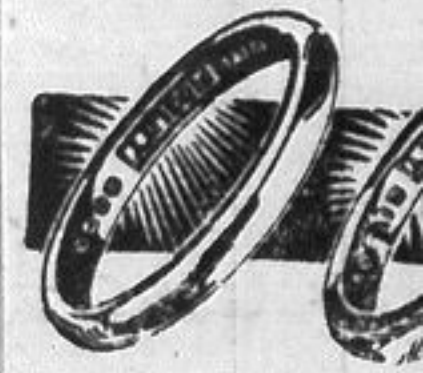
