PROVINCIAL JOURNALISTS

After prolonged discussions, an agreement on wages, hours and conditions affecting provincial journalists has been reached as between the Irish Master Printers' Association and the National Union of Journalists. The negotiations were brought to a successful conclusion last week and the agreement was formally signed on Monday by Mr. J. Flynn, Chairman, T.M.P.A., and Mr. P. Fullerton-Bustard, Organising Secretary, N.U.J. The agreement provides for a minimum weekly wage of £7 payable at the age of 24 years to men having four years service. It also provides for a scale of wages for entrants to the profession and regulates the number of apprentices. The working week has been fixed at 44 hours. tinian Church, Annual holidays of at least two weeks were guaranteed, but in the case of senior men the L.M.P.A undertook to recommend three weeks' annual leave.

The agreement became operative from the date of signing, 31st January.
