Dairy cows and heifers:—The entry showed a slight increase as compared with last week and included many lots of good quality cows and heifers. Buyers again attended strongly, but with the absence of representatives for Dublin and Cross-Channel markets, as a result of a slower trade in Dublin on Wednesday, bidding was not as free as at recent markets. The local demand was, however, sufficiently strong to effect a very good clearance and turnover, which exceeded last week's figure. Top price for in-calf cows went to Mr. C. McNamara, Limerick, at 40 gns. Top price for calved cows went to Mr. C. O'Shea, Newmarket, Co. Cork, at 39½ gns. Top price for in-calf heifers went to Mr. Joseph O'Brien, Ballyvarra, Lisnagry, at 42 gns. In-calf and calved cows, best, £37 to £40; seconds, £31 10s. to £36 10s.; others, £24 to £29; in-calf and calved heifers, best, £38 10s. to £42; seconds, £32 10s. to £37 10s.; others, £26 to £31.

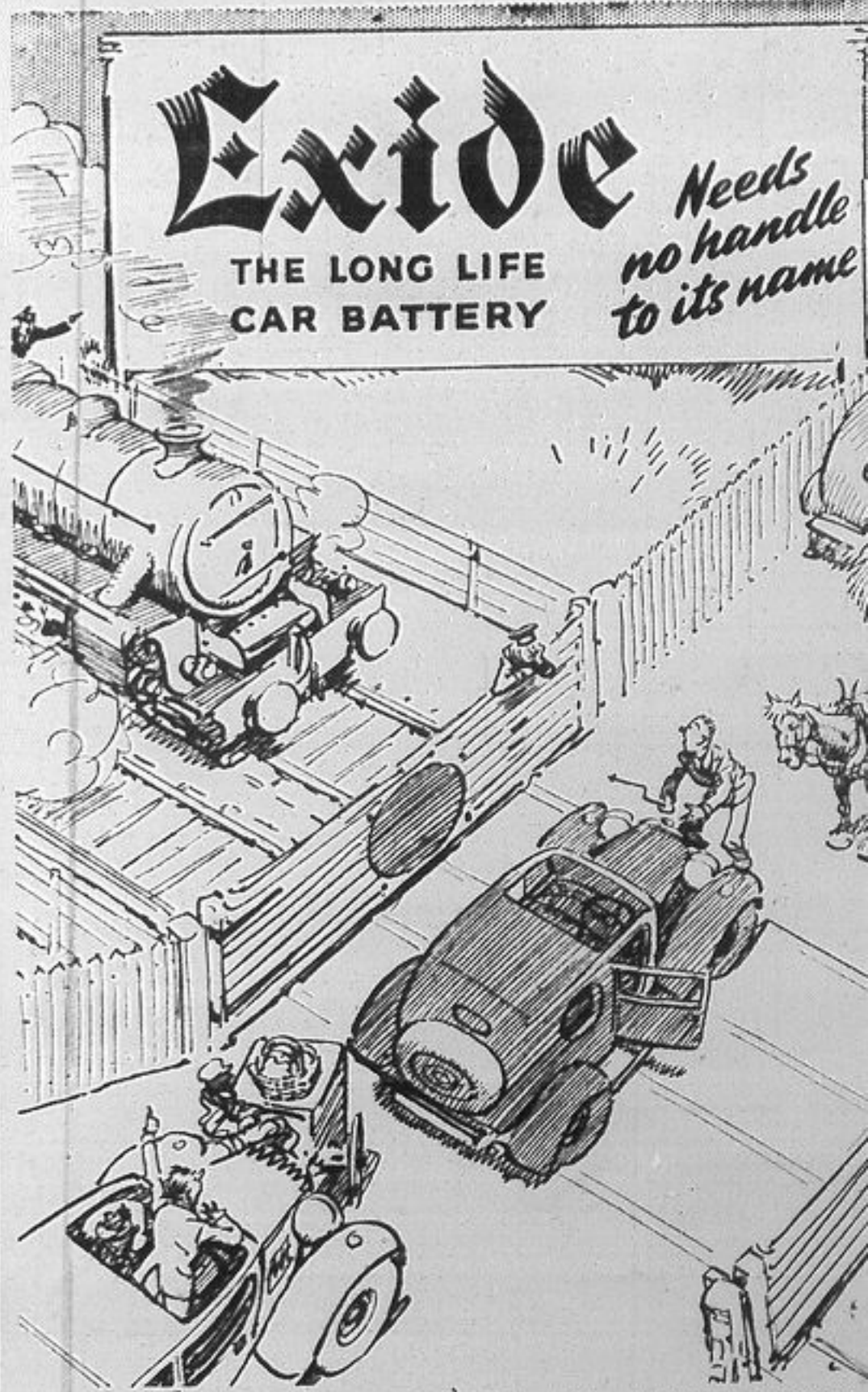
