## DEATH OF MR. JOHN BARRY

A highly popular Limerick man passed away at Dagenham, Essex, yesterday, in the person of Mr. Michael Casey, brother of Mr. J. M. Casey, P.C., ex-Mayor and member of the Limerick Labour Party. Deceased, who was prominently connected with the printing trade, spending many years in that business in Cork, went to England about eight years ago and held a good position there since in the same trade. He had been ailing since Christmas, and when he got a bad change his brother, Mr. James M. Casey, flew to his bedside from Rineanna yesterday. Death, however, had supervened some hours before the latter arrived. The late Michael Casey, who had reached his 72nd year, was actively identified with boxing in his earlier years and took a keen interest in that pastime all through life.
