Ennis Urban Council received a (aylor) 2 shock at a special meeting on Friday night, when Mr. D. Blackinter) 3 well, County Manager, submitted detailed figures with reference to Vengeful, Ponti- the cost and rent of 96 houses in course of erection in the town for working housing of the the classes.

County Manager Blackwell said the original intention of the Council had been to erect houses which could be let to tenants at a rent of about 5/- or 6/- per week. On the figures he had before him that expectation could not be realised. If the Council let the houses at 6/per week each, they would lose £2,082 per year on the 96 houses. The economic rent of the houses worked out at 19/10 per house plus rates. He anticipated the rate this year would be 30/- in the f; therefore, the rate on each house would be 3/6, making the total payable by the tenant, £1 3s. 4d. per week. In order to charge a rent that the Council would have a reasonable chance of collecting from the class of tenants for whom the houses were being built the rates would have to contribute £20 per house per annum.

Mr. O. Linnane said unless the grants and subsidies from State funds were largely increased it meant the end of house building in Ennis and many other towns similarly situated. He suggested that the full facts be placed before e Founded, 100/9 the Minister for Local Covern-
