MOTOR AND 'BUS

Collision Sequel

CITY COURT CASE

A slight collision between a motor car and a C.I.E. passenger 'bus at Sarsfield Bridge on the 12th March, was described in the City District Court this afternoon, when Michael Lane, c/o. West Clare Creameries, was charged with the dangerous driving of the motor car.

He was also summoned for not keeping the brakes of his car in a good and efficient working order.

Supt. P. Coleran, prosecuted, and Mr. D. J. O'Malley, solicitor, defendant.

Peter O'Flaherty said that on Saturday, 12th March, he was driving a 'bus into the city towards Sarsfield Bridge. He crossed the road and as he was about to get on the bridge he noticed a car coming from the right from O'Callaghan Strand, and the defendant did not appear to be taking much notice of the 'bus. A little later witness heard a bump at the rere of the 'bus. Witness sounded the horn while the defendant's car was not going fast. The defendant passed the remark that he did not see the 'bus.

STATEMENT FROM THE DEFENDANT.

Guard McLoughlin gave evidence of taking a statement from the defendant. In that statement the defendant said he was partly in the centre of the road partly to his correct side and his speed was not more than 3 m.p.h. He (defendant) added that he had been watching traffic on his right when the 'bus cut across him.

Guard McKenna gave evidence of examining the defendant's car and found that the hand-brake was totally defective.

Sergeant Caulfield said that the car hit the 'bus a little to the front of the right rere wheel, and there was very little damage caused.

None of the foregoing witnesses was cross-examined.

Michael Lane said that he was driving since 1924 and was never involved in an accident previously. On the occasion of the accident, he was waiting for vehicular traffic on the right to pass and he did not see the 'bus. Witness had been told that the hand-brake was only looked upon as an anchor brake.
