LETTER FROM MR. RUSSELL

(To the Editor, "Limerick Leader.")

A Chara,

DLEASE allow me to correct a misleading reference, in the Leading Article of your week-end edition of June 11th, to the recent successful Clann na Poblachta meeting at the O'Connell Monument, Limerick.

In the course of what is intended to be a general criticism of the present Inter-Party Government, the article in question states that "at a recent meeting in Limerock some figures were given to show that a large number of new industries were set up by the Coalition. The fact is, of course-but the speaker was careful not to mention it—that the plans for all the industries in question had actually been drawn up and made ready for practical adoption before Fianna Fail left office."

As the speaker referred to, I would like to refuts most emphatically the innuendo contained in the above paragraph. As you are, no doubt, aware, my reference to the industries sanctioned and established since the present Government came into office was intended to disprove the statement made by a speaker at Mr. Lemass's meeting a few days previous that "no industries would be established in the country under the present regime."

I do not, of course, know from what source, if any, you obtained YEAR-OLD the information that all industries sanctioned by the present Minister were drawn up and made ready for practical adoption before the last Government left office. My statement was based on the figures given by the Minister for Industry and Commerce when introducing the estimates for his Department special recently in the Dail, together with other information at my disposal.
