### Little Boy's Death

#### DRAGGED BY DONKEY

N accident which had fatal A consequences occurred near Drombanna, Co. Limerick, on Friday night, when the victim was a little boy aged nine years and nine months.

It appears that the boy, Michael Moloney, was making arrangements for visiting Limerick with relatives on Saturday morning in order to procure some provisions.

#### TRAGIC RIDE.

It was the custom of young Moloney to fetch a donkey which grazed in a nearby field, and as usual he took the animal to bring it home. It seems that on this occasion he sat on the back of the donkey to ride home, and finding that the reins were too long, he tied these around his waist.
