BICYCLES TAKEN

WITHOUT PERMISSION OF OWNERS

Two defendants appeared before Justice Gleeson in the Limerick Liberties Court on Wednesday, charged with taking bicycles without the owner's permission.

The first was Martin O'Grady, Ballyglass, Ardnacrusha, who pleaded guilty to taking the bicycle of Thomas Quinn, an E.S.B. employee at Ardnacrusha.

Supt. Lavan prosecuted and the defendant was not professionally represented.

Thomas Quinn swore that when he went to get his bicycle on June 4th to cycle the four miles home, O'Grady had taken it without his permission.

O'Grady told the Justice that he had been permitted on numerous previous occasions to ride Quinn's cycle and took his permission for granted on this occasion.

The Justice imposed a fine of 20/- to be paid within 14 days, or a month in jail in default.

The second defendant was Patrick Shinnors, 84 Lenihan Avenue, Prospect, who admitted that on May 22nd, he took the bicycle of Jeremiah Ryan, Wolfe Tone Street.

Inspector T. Griffin, who prosecuted, said that Ryan left his bicycle in a cycle park at Ballysimon while at a hurling match. The defendant took it and was found
